

May we learn to love ourselves first, and others, not only throughout the month of love, of women's day, or Mother's Day, but all year long and harder on darker days.


The past two months had major turmoil and we're all learning to navigate through stormy weather. Impatiently waiting for spring with brighter, warmer, and peaceful days.

In the News: Meet Athens' New Mayor



On January 1st, 2024, Haris Doukas, the newly appointed mayor of Athens assumed office. He had announced his candidacy for Athens mayor in August 2023 and won the 2nd round of elections held in October, garnering 41.35% in the polls.

Outgoing Athens mayor, Kostas Bakoyannis attended the ceremony and congratulated his successor.

43 years old, Haris Doukas is a mechanical engineer and Professor of energy policy and management at the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering of the National Technical University of Athens. He has more than 150 scientific publications in international scientific journals and has received an award for his contribution as an expert at the World Renewable Energy Congress.

His priority is to ensure that all his actions contribute to a cleaner city environmentally.

"We believe in social participation, in citizen intervention as a necessary condition for the changes the city needs. So in this environment, today, I want to tell you that nothing is impossible," he noted, promising a "green, clean, safe and creative Athens for everyone."




In the News: One Note Man Shortlisted for the Oscars

"The One Note Man" is a British short comedy-drama film of 22 minutes which was written, produced and directed in 2023 by George Siougas. Without a word of dialogue, it tells the dull routine of a lonely bassoonist, starring Jason Watkins, which sums up to riding his bicycle to the opera house where all he gets to do is play one note on his bassoon in an orchestra everyday.

Until one day, he breaks his routine and his life changes forever. This heartwarming short-film was described as "quite possibly the most enchanting Christmas fable [...] witnessed in years" by Benjamin Franz from Film Threat, the online film review publication. It is also qualified to be considered for the 2024 BAFTA. A small heads up on the film's writer/director.





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He moved to the UK to study at the London Film School. He produced 5 short films that competed in more than fifty festivals worldwide and won 5 Grand Prix and 4 Best Director Awards. In 2002 he was headhunted to direct "Close Your Eyes" a drama series for Mega TV in Greece. The series was a huge hit in the history of Greek TV which made him win 5 awards at the 2003 Hellenic TV Awards, including Best Director. From this pint George's career took off and he directed across all platforms for 10 years.

In 2012 he completed his debut feature "Burning Heads" (aka "To Gala") that not only was nominated for 11 awards by the Hellenic Film Academy but also won Best Actor & Best Actress awards at Alexandria Film Festival as well as Best Actor & Best Film in the London Greek Film Festival.

In the same year, with the collapse of Greece's economy, George moved along with his family to Cyprus but in 2015 they relocated to UK where he directs for UK broadcasters.



In the News: Another Award Goes to...

Yorghos Lanthimos is a name you'll want to remember! He's the Greek director that made himself a name amongst the leaders of cinema.

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His latest comedy/fantasy "Poor Things" featuring Emma Stone, Mark Ruffalo, Margaret Qualley, William Dafoe, etc. was nominated in eleven categories and won two awards: Best Motion Picture & Best Actress.


Back in 2019, he was nominated Best Director & Best Picture for "The Favourite" and in 2017, Lanthimos got another nomination for "Lobster".

Did you know though that the first Greek to be nominated was back in 1935, for the choreography of "Top Hat" along with Fred Astaire & Ginger Rogers, it was Ermis Panagiotopoulos.

While receiving his award, Lanthimos paid tribute to his biggest admirer, Bruce Springsteen, present in the audience: "I just want to speak to Bruce Springsteen. We have the same birthday. He's been my hero since I grew up."

His life in a glimpse: he was born in Pangrati on September 23rd, 1973. Followed his father's footsteps into playing basketball for Pangrati BC. Attended Moraitis school then studied business administration. Dropped out however and studied instead film and television at the Hellenic Cinema & Television School Stavrakos in Athens. He is a part of a postmodern film movement known as the "Greek Weird Wave" and most of his films are influenced by his Greek heritage. Both The Lobster (Colin Farell & Rachel Weisz) & The Killing of a Sacred Deer (Colin Farell, Nicole Kidman) competed for the Palme d'Or.





"Lanthimos' films arent for everyone. They're dead pan and clinically detached. At times they feel like dispatches from a distant alien planet", quoted Chris Nashawatay of Entertainment Weekly.

Off cameras, he is married to Ariane Labed since 2013, Greek-French actress whom he met while acting and producing Attenberg in 2010.

In 2004, he was a member of the creative team that designed both the opening and the closure ceremonies of the 2004 Summer Olympics.



Q: When did the two of you first meet?

EMMA STONE: It was June of 2015, in a cafe. I was in rehearsals for "La La Land," and I met him to talk about "The Favourite." I thought he was going to be really scary and twisted, and he isn't. It was a very comfortable and easy conversation and we got along right away.

Q: You thought he might be a more intimidating presence?

STONE: Having seen the films that he had made up until that point, yeah.

YORGOS LANTHIMOS: What a cliché.

STONE: I was 26! I was but a child. But from then on, we kept in touch and got to know each other a little bit. By the time we were making "The Favourite," we had a rapport and the beginning of our friendship, and then by the end of shooting it, we started talking about "Poor Things."

Athens most historic theatre has been forced to stop its screenings, after more than a century in business.


Friday, December 28, **Ideal cinema** closed its doors with a final screening of "Pulp Fiction" by Quentin Tarantino at 9:00 pm. The theatre was fully booked ahead of schedule.

Not only was Ideal one of the most historic and magnificent theatre, it was the first one to bring the Dolby Stereo sound to Greece. It was also an impressive four storey building of 7.115 sq.m., designed by Ernst Ziller, a German architect and one of the most prominent representatives of Greek neoclassical architecture, and was located on central Panepistimiou Street, in the Schliemann-Mela Mansion.

The mansion comprised a ground floor, a mezzanine, and four storeys above which a building was added later on, and in its patio was housed the historical movie theatre of 829 sq.m.

Heinrich Schlieman was the German archaeologist that unearthed the legendary city of Troy. He was born on January 6, 1822, and his love for Ancient Greece and Troy in particular, was passed on to him by his father who used to recite him stories when he was young.

The hotel chain Mitsis acquired the old mansion and plan to convert it to a luxury hotel with a 36 million euro renovation. The cinema will get its remake as well and be turned into a theatre and conference center. It will be assigned to an international company in the field of entertainment.





In the News: Greek Flags Exhibiting

On Thursday March 14th at 19:00, the exhibition "Our Flags, Brilliant Cloths, Historical Signs" by the visual artist Mairili Harami was inaugurated at the City of Athens Arts Centre in Ambelokipi. This is an event organized by the Greek Music Workshop of the Municipality of Athens, through the Culture, Sports and Youth Organization of the Municipality of Athens (OPANDA) in view of the National Day.

The exhibition will run till April 7, with a free entrance. It displays around 50 historic flags, and the artist tried to reproduce the flags using linen fabrics, natural dyes and ancient techniques.

Γαλανόλευκη, Galanólefki, aka the national flag of Greece, popularly referred to as the "turquoise and white one" has a 200-year history; it was initially conceived during the Greek War of Independence declared against the Ottoman Empire on 1821.

It has seen many versions throughout historical events before this final version was adopted as the National flag of Greece. The exhibition of these historic flags pays homage to all brave patriotic Greeks, to their struggles, sacrifices, contribution and drive to free their homeland.

For every flag, there were countless fighters who fought with passion. Some even defended it with their own lives. But there were mothers who waved hair, sisters who dyed yarn, women who wove, dreamers who drew, artisans who painted, girls who embroidered.

The Law 851/1978 "Regarding the National Flag, the War Flags and the Emblem of the President of the Republic" determines the flag's colours, design and ratio (2:3), and also the places and times where a flag or ensign must (or can) be flown, the type of pole used, when it should be flown half-mast, the contexts in which the use of the flag is forbidden etc. (*#greeknewsagenda*)

All requests should be addressed by email in order to obtain an appointment.

Visa Applications: For visa applications please visit our website www.mfa.gr/missionabroad/en/lebanon-en

All permanent residents in Lebanon can apply for their touristic visa at VFS offices <u>https://visa.vfsglobal.com/lbn/en/grc/</u>

Passport renewal or issuance: You will get an appointment by receiving an email. Required documents are: 2 photo passport size (4x6), a Greek identity card or a birth certificate (that can be provided by the Embassy if you send in advance any old Greek birth or family certificate).

Legalization of documents: The Consular Office can legalize any Lebanese official document that has been stamped by the Lebanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs. You can visit the Consulate any week day between 09:30 and 13:30.

Power of Attorney: The Consular Office can exceptionally provide a power of attorney to Lebanese citizens that have already made an investment in Greece and want to apply for a residence permit.

Marriage, birth, death registration: Required documents: The Lebanese certificates of marriage, birth or death stamped by the Lebanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs and translated in Greek (translations in English or French are accepted as well).

Any old Greek birth or family certificate to be sent in advance by email.

The Consular Office is currently upgrading the embassy's website in order to make it more friendly user and to provide all necessary information and downloadable documents.

Embassy Section: Latest Exhibitions

The Office for Economic and Commercial Affairs affiliated with the Embassy of Greece in Lebanon promoted the below trade exhibitions for January, February and March.



From March 2nd to March 4th, 2024, the largest Greek Wine Exhibition, Oenorama 2024 took take place in Athens, at Zappeion Megaron with the Lebanese participation. Following coordination between the Office and the peer wine associations and national institutes of Greece and Lebanon last year, five top Lebanese wineries participated to the above international trade show, which hosted more than 250 exhibitors, 2.300 wines and 10.000 professional visitors, during the 3-day exhibition.

It was the first institutional lebanese participation to take place in a similar event after a long time, a fact highly appreciated by Greece and the institutional bodies of vine and wine.



Greek Sweet Island Pies With Feta Cheese - Lihnarakia

17 Servings 10 min Preparation 1h Resting 40 min Cooking #tsoulotip: Press the pleats in the dough securely, so they don't open up while baking.

INGREDIENTS

For dough: 450 g soft flour 40 g granulated sugar 2 teaspoons baking powder 1 medium egg 185 ml full fat milk 60 ml sunflower oil 1 egg yolk, diluted with a little water, for egg wash Ground cinnamon, for sprinkling

For filling:

180 g Greek Feta cheese, crumbled 180 g Greek sweet Myzithra cheese, grated 1 medium egg 30 g granulated sugar 1 teaspoon Greek honey 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon ¹/4 teaspoon mastic, crushed

METHOD

1. Preheat oven to 180° C Fan.

2. For the dough: In a mixer's bowl, add the flour, sugar, baking powder, egg, milk and sunflower oil. Beat on high speed with the whisk attachment, until you create a smooth, soft dough. When ready, remove dough from bowl and wrap in cellophane. Refrigerate for 1 hour.

3. For the filling: In a bowl, add all of the ingredients for the filling and mix thoroughly.

4. When dough is ready, dust a clean working surface with flour. Add the dough and use a rolling pin to roll it out into a rectangular shape that is 3cm thick.

5. Using a 10 cm round dough cutter or a glass, cut the dough into circles

6. Add 1 ½ teaspoons of filling in the center of each circle of dough and pinch the border to create pleats. When ready, transfer to a baking pan lined with parchment paper.

7. Brush the pies with the egg wash and bake for 20 minutes.

8. When ready, allow the Lihnarakia to cool for 5-10 minutes, sprinkle with cinnamon and serve.


